







SUCCESSFUL TRANSFORMATION OF CONVENTIONAL VOCATION INTO MULTIMEDIA WORKSTATION IN LIVES OF SPECIALLY-ABLED

In the world of modern technology, role of technology in different segments and industries have ascended. It was hard to accept for many, the theory of being able to produce work considering an individual's abilities, difficulties and challenges along with meeting and fulfilling the expectations of customers. Not only this, but to make work people with diverse needs proficiently while understanding the discipline of handling projects, understanding market strategies, implementation of organisational skills and delivery of projects with punctuality. Similar dilemmas were observed in the minds of parents and educators associated with Mirra Charitable Trust in Chennai. Dilemmas disappeared and revolution in the thought process occurred when in March 2017 a thought to introduce vocational program in the rehabilitation set up stroke in the minds of the management of Mirra Charitable Trust. The thought appeared in order to create a career path, build sustainable livelihood, update the system with new age learning methods, implementation of technology-based work oriented programs, involve tactile learning methods and therapeutic appraoch to enhance and improve different skills. Mirra embarked on its journey in the Multimedia program through AIMS Media, Delhi. The AEMP program of AIMS Media namely **Learning Based and Project Based AEMP** met all these requirements. The journey began with a lot of questions and unknowns as below and resulted to answer all with satisfactory evidences:

- 1. How children/adult with special needs will achieve the expected outcomes considering their challenges?
- 2. Will these children/adults be able to build a sustainable livelihood?
- 3. What are the future dimensions of the program?
- 4. How they will be readied to accept the live projects and deliver it well on time?

The association of AIMS Media and Mirra brought an evolution in the learning methods of children/adults with special needs. Every aspect of the program was followed to the letter and spirit and customization was done to enable achieving maximum efficacy of the program. The first batch of students after completing their training of the prominent program of AEMP focused on the learning and to teach the discipline of handling foreseen market-oriented projects i.e. Learning Based-AEMP have now finished first year of Project Based- AEMP.

Project based AEMP an advance diploma program involves punctilious process which consists of meticulous training, structured methods to monitor, track and evaluate which further assist to achieve the expected outcomes of the program followed by:

- 1. **Repetitive practice** and homework and constant monitoring, provision of aids helped them in performing the tasks independently.
- 2. Involvement of **extracurricular activities** covering various facets of communication and social skill development.
- 3. **Interventions** given on a need basis and notified improving in self-esteem and confidence of the students that further helped reduced behaviour issues considerably.
- 4. The parents, staff at Mirra have been forthcoming in **identifying assignments and projects** for our students to work on in addition to the projects assigned by AIMS Media.
- 5. Students are **encouraged to be independent** and the level of independence in completing a task is given more importance than the end product.
- 6. **Parent empowerment Training Program** to mentor the parents towards becoming advocates for the skills of their wards and also for donning the role of a project manager while executing projects.








PARENTS EMPOWERMENT TRAINING PROGRAM


Parents Empowerment Training Program is conducted to empower the parents, to train them and help to achieve the following aspects:
